CHAPTER 01

The Five-Minute Buying Plan

Alex's rule is simple: reject a beautiful listing early if the weight, storage, or order process does not fit your real routine. That saves more disappointment than another hour of comparing faces.

Step 1: decide where the doll will live

Start with the physical environment. Measure the storage space, the route from the front door, and the area where the doll will be cleaned and dried. Include door width, stairs, tight corners, and any point where the package or doll must be lifted. A discreet closet is not useful if the body cannot lie without pressure or if ventilation is poor after cleaning.

Write these measurements down in both inches and centimeters. A listing height does not describe shoulder width, hip width, bent-leg storage, or carton dimensions. When space is tight, ask support for the measurements that control the purchase rather than relying on a photograph.

Step 2: set a handling limit

Choose a maximum weight that can be lifted and turned without unstable twisting. Compare it with a real object or supervised gym movement rather than imagining the number. A doll behaves like an awkward dead weight. It cannot shift its center of gravity, hold a rail, or help during a transfer.

Buyers with stairs, pain, limited grip, or a need for frequent cleaning should make weight a primary filter. A compact model or torso can be a sensible choice even when a larger product is affordable. A wheeled surface, lifting strap, or another adult's help may improve the routine, but equipment should not become a reason to exceed a safe personal limit.

Step 3: choose the construction family

Decide whether TPE, silicone, a silicone-head hybrid, or a specialty construction best fits the desired feel, finish, care routine, and budget. Do this before comparing dozens of faces. Material is not a complete quality score, but it determines which products belong in the first shortlist.

When softness is the priority, compare the manufacturer's formulation rather than assuming every TPE body feels the same. When fine surface finish is the priority, compare silicone products but still check firmness, weight, and painted-detail care. When budget is the priority, compare the configured total and current care requirements rather than the base price alone.

Step 4: choose order type and deadline

If the doll is needed by a particular date, start with verified warehouse inventory and leave room for carrier delays. A factory order gives more control over the final build but includes production, approval, dispatch, and transit stages. A date shown as an estimate is not a guarantee unless DollWow can operationally support the promise in writing.

Step 5: compare the final configuration

Create a simple shortlist of three to five exact products. Record the body, head, material, height, weight, starting price, selected options, order type, and unanswered questions. Remove a product when an essential fact cannot be confirmed. More options do not automatically make an order better; each option adds cost, compatibility questions, or production complexity.

Step 6: plan the first month of ownership

Before checkout, know where the doll will be inspected, cleaned, dried, dressed, and stored. Have the manufacturer-approved basics ready, but avoid buying strong cleaners, generic adhesives, or powders before the material is confirmed. Save the order summary, support conversation, and product screenshots. These records make delivery inspection and any later support request much easier.

No single motive describes every buyer. A responsible guide should not diagnose the buyer, promise emotional outcomes, or suggest that a product replaces a person. Jesse's review standard is to treat the purchase as an adult decision that deserves privacy, clear information, and realistic expectations.

If a purchase affects a relationship, discussing boundaries, storage, spending, and privacy may matter as much as choosing the product. The practical question is whether the decision is informed, consensual where another person is involved, and manageable for the buyer.

Private sexual use

For many buyers, the doll is an adult sexual product. The useful purchasing questions remain concrete: which form and material are wanted, which openings or components are fixed or removable, what cleaning routine applies, and whether the body can be handled safely. Marketing language about a doll's personality does not answer these questions.

Buyers should also distinguish fantasy from product capability. A pose in a photograph may require support. An oral feature may differ by head. Heating may cover one part of the body rather than the entire surface. A product can be appropriate for the intended use only when the relevant construction and care instructions are clear.

Collecting, styling, and photography

Collectors may prioritize sculpt, makeup, head and body compatibility, clothing fit, posing, or a manufacturer's artistic direction. These buyers often compare details that a first-time buyer overlooks: neck transition, eye alignment, hand and foot finish, implanted hair work, body painting, and how a joint holds a photographic pose.

Photography creates its own practical requirements. Standing or seated scenes need appropriate support. Clothing must be tested for dye transfer. Repeated styling can increase friction around wigs, implanted hair, eyelashes, and makeup. A visually led purchase still needs a storage and handling plan.

Shared decisions

Some couples choose a doll together. The product can become part of a shared sexual life, a photography hobby, or a private fantasy. Clear discussion helps when the purchase affects shared finances, living space, privacy, or relationship boundaries. The discussion should cover who chooses the configuration, who handles cleaning, where the doll is stored, and whether photographs or account details are private.

There is no universal script for this conversation. Jesse's guidance is to avoid presenting the doll as a test, threat, or substitute for consent. Each person can express a boundary, and a purchase does not

create an obligation to participate.

Privacy and predictability

Other buyers value a private, predictable product experience. That can make discreet communication and storage especially important. Privacy should be planned across the whole transaction: browser and account access, payment records, email subjects, delivery notifications, package size, the path into the home, and long-term storage.

The buyer does not owe strangers an explanation. At the same time, privacy marketing should be specific. A plain outer carton does not answer what appears on a billing statement or how a carrier schedules delivery. Those are separate questions for the seller.

Full-size dolls

Full-size models provide the broadest range of heads, bodies, materials, and custom options. They are often selected for life-scale proportion, clothing, photography, or a more complete visual presence. Their main ownership demand is handling. A full-size body can weigh from roughly the range of a large suitcase to well over **100 lb / 45.4 kg**, depending on construction. The exact listing matters more than any category average.

Look beyond height. Shoulder width, hip width, breast or chest construction, limb length, and the position of the center of mass affect carrying and storage. A **5 ft 3 in / 160 cm** body may be heavier than a taller model that uses more internal foam or a different lightweight structure.

Full-size products also tend to expose more choices. That is useful when the buyer has a precise configuration in mind, but it increases the need for a saved written order. Head, body, skin tone, eye color, wig, makeup, standing feet, skeleton, and electronic options should all refer to the same final build.

Mini and petite dolls

Mini and petite are shopping terms rather than universal engineering standards. DollWow uses height-based collections as a practical starting point, but manufacturers may use the words differently. A compact doll can offer easier storage and a shorter carrying path while still being dense or wide.

Check proportions as well as height. Some compact bodies intentionally use stylized bust, hips, head scale, or fantasy features. Buyers seeking life-scale proportion should inspect the measurement table and full-body photographs. Buyers choosing compact size for privacy should also ask about carton

dimensions and packaging weight.

Torsos and hips

Torso products remove much of the full-body footprint and can be easier to store. They can also be heavy for their height because the material is concentrated around the torso or hips. The shortlist in this guide includes a **2 ft 7 in / 80 cm** silicone torso listed at **30.8 lb / 14.0 kg** and a shorter **2 ft 1 in / 63 cm** TPE torso listed at **57.3 lb / 26.0 kg**. Those two examples show why height alone is a poor handling estimate.

Compare whether the product includes a head, arms, thighs, or removable components. Determine how it rests during use and storage. A flat base, integrated stand, soft lower surface, or irregular form can change the best support method.

Male dolls

Male dolls may use TPE, silicone, or mixed construction and can carry substantial weight through the shoulders, chest, and limbs. Compare body proportions, genital construction, head material, insert or fixed components, and supported posing. Do not assume that a feature available on one male body appears across the brand.

The male category is smaller than the general doll market, so a buyer may need to compare several brands to find the right build. Start with the [male doll collection](#), then compare exact shoulder, chest, waist, hip, limb, foot, and weight measurements rather than relying on a masculine product name.

Hybrid dolls

A common hybrid uses a silicone head with a TPE body. It can offer a particular balance of facial finish, body softness, and price. Hybrid ownership requires two care paths. Face makeup, eyelashes, eyes, and hair may need a gentler routine than the unpainted body surface. The neck connection and skin-tone match should be checked on the exact pairing.

Specialty and fantasy formats

Fantasy, anime-inspired, stylized, robotic, and electronic products deserve the same factual comparison as conventional dolls. Styling can be the reason to buy, but it does not remove practical limits. Horns, ears, tails, elaborate wigs, unusual feet, or electronic heads may change storage, cleaning, or replacement needs.

Use clear adult-only boundaries. DollWow does not allow underage-coded or school-themed presentation. A small body measurement does not by itself establish how a product is presented, so the complete product context, branding, styling, and catalog policy must remain adult.

CHAPTER 04

TPE, Silicone, and Hybrid Construction

TPE and silicone are families of formulations, not single universal recipes. Two manufacturers can use materials with noticeably different softness, oil behavior, finish, tear resistance, and care requirements. Brand and product instructions therefore matter more than generic claims.

Neither material wins every comparison. Choose based on the actual formulation, body construction, handling needs, care routine, and total price. Avoid blanket claims such as "odor-free," "hypoallergenic," or "medical grade" unless the manufacturer provides documentation for the exact product.

A hybrid doll may use a silicone head with a TPE body or another approved combination. Confirm the neck connection, color match, head weight, and separate care requirements. Do not assume that any head from a brand fits every body from that brand.

Understanding TPE

TPE stands for thermoplastic elastomer, a broad family of materials that combine elastic behavior with thermoplastic processing. In the doll category, manufacturers tune formulations for softness, stretch, surface feel, color, and manufacturing needs. This is why one TPE doll can feel or behave differently from another.

TPE is often selected for softness and value. Many formulations have a flexible, yielding feel, particularly in areas with more material volume. The same softness can make the surface more vulnerable to pressure marks, tearing at stressed areas, or dye transfer. Formulation, body geometry, internal foam, and handling all affect the result.

Some TPE formulations release process oils over time. That does not justify applying the same powdering schedule to every product. Ask which surface product the manufacturer approves, how often it is expected, and whether the face or painted areas need separate treatment. Avoid talc inhalation and do

not substitute a scented or medicated powder merely because it has a similar texture.

TPE care usually rewards gentle handling. Support the weight instead of pulling limbs, avoid forcing joints, protect the surface from dark fabrics, and store without sharp folds or prolonged compression. Heat guidance should come from the manufacturer. A temperature mentioned for another TPE product is not a safe operating limit for the selected doll.

Understanding silicone

Silicone is also a family of formulations. Manufacturers may vary catalyst system, hardness, pigments, fillers, surface finish, and the way soft areas are constructed. Full-silicone does not describe one uniform feel.

Silicone is often chosen for sculpt and surface detail. It can support finely defined facial features, texture, body painting, veins, freckles, and makeup. Some manufacturers use very soft silicone in breasts, buttocks, or selected body regions while maintaining firmer structure elsewhere. Others prioritize lower weight or tear resistance. These choices can create noticeable differences between brands.

Silicone surfaces are often described as less absorbent than TPE, but they are not immune to staining, abrasion, compression, or damage. Dark fabric should still be tested. Makeup, eyelashes, implanted hair, and painted details remain delicate. Cleaning a plain silicone body surface is different from scrubbing a finished face.

Silicone can also be heavy. Newer foam cores and weight-reduction methods may reduce mass, but marketing names do not provide the final number. Compare the listed weight. The 24-product shortlist in this guide includes full-silicone examples from about **57.3 lb / 26.0 kg** to more than **100 lb / 45.4 kg**, with several weights still awaiting confirmation.

Hybrid and component-level care

Mixed construction means the buyer should identify each component. A silicone head on a TPE body is common, but other combinations exist. Ask which cleaner, lubricant, powder, repair material, and storage method applies to each part. A product safe for the body may damage face paint, adhesive, eyelashes, or electronics.

The neck connection deserves attention. Confirm connector type, thread, adapter, and whether the chosen head is approved for the body. A heavy head can affect neck handling and storage. Skin-tone names may also vary between materials, so request a confirmed match instead of assuming identical option labels produce an identical color.

How to make a material decision

Use this sequence:

1. Decide the desired surface feel and finish.
2. Set a maximum handling weight.
3. Compare exact products in both materials.
4. Review stain prevention, cleaning, drying, and ongoing surface care.
5. Check whether the desired head, body, and options exist in that construction.
6. Compare the complete configured price.
7. Ask for clarification when a named formulation or care claim matters.

A buyer who values softness may prefer one TPE formulation or an ultra-soft silicone region. A buyer who values detailed facial finish may prefer a silicone head without needing a full-silicone body. A buyer with a strict handling limit may choose whichever exact product meets the weight constraint. Material is a decision tool, not a status label.

Claims that need evidence

Treat the following words as claims that require product-specific documentation: body-safe, medical-grade, hypoallergenic, odor-free, antibacterial, non-toxic, tear-proof, stain-proof, waterproof, self-healing, and maintenance-free. A retailer repeating the words does not establish them. Ask what test, certification, formulation, or manufacturer statement supports the description.

The same caution applies to lifespan. A seller cannot know how long an individual product will last without considering formulation, construction, frequency of handling, storage, cleaning, and accidental damage. A range offered as marketing should not become a guarantee.

CHAPTER 05

Advanced Materials Need Brand-Level Verification

Terms such as S-TPE, ultra-soft silicone, SLE, gel-filled areas, and lightweight construction may describe meaningful manufacturer technologies. They may also be used inconsistently across the market. Ask what the named feature changes on the exact body: softness, weight, finish, care, repair, compatibility, or price.

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When a special material is important to the purchase, confirm:

- Which body or head uses it.
- Whether it changes softness, weight, durability, or care.
- Whether it is standard or a paid option.
- Whether it changes production time.
- Which cleaning, powder, lubricant, and storage instructions apply.

Manufacturer terminology belongs in the brand or product section. It should not be presented as a universal industry standard without evidence.

Named TPE developments

Terms such as S-TPE or other enhanced TPE names may refer to a manufacturer's attempt to change softness, resilience, tear behavior, oil release, or finish. The name alone does not establish how much the formulation differs from standard TPE or whether it is available across every body.

Before using a named TPE technology as a buying reason, ask which current products use it, whether the head and body both use it, and which care instructions differ. If the brand publishes comparative test data, record what was tested and under which conditions. A multiplier such as "eight times stronger" is incomplete without a test method, comparison material, sample geometry, and source.

Named silicone and lightweight systems

Manufacturers may offer ultra-soft silicone, platinum-cure descriptions, soft-butt or soft-breast systems, foam cores, lightweight skeletons, and proprietary reduced-weight bodies. Each label should be connected to a listed body and a current weight.

Softness can introduce tradeoffs. A softer region may need more support, gentler clothing, or different expectations around compression. A lighter body may use more internal foam, which can change the feel or distribution of weight. Neither change is automatically an improvement for every buyer.

Gel-filled and layered areas

Some dolls offer gel-filled breasts, buttocks, thighs, or other soft regions. Confirm what is filled, whether it is standard or optional, and how the area should be handled. Avoid sharp pressure, prolonged compression, or unsupported claims about the filler. If damage occurs, do not attempt a generic puncture repair without the manufacturer's instruction.

Evidence checklist for a special material

- Official name and manufacturer.
- Exact bodies or heads that use it.
- Current listed weight for the selected build.
- Stated purpose, such as softness, detail, or weight reduction.
- Care differences from the brand's standard material.
- Compatibility with heating, electronics, implanted hair, or other options.
- Repair path and approved materials.
- Source date and any stated test conditions.

When these details are unavailable, the honest description is that the feature needs confirmation. A high search volume or a competitor's confident paragraph does not close the evidence gap.

CHAPTER 06

How to Read Product Specifications

A specification table looks objective, but it still needs interpretation. Values can describe a base body, a body with one head, a packaged shipment, or a particular material version. Translations and catalog updates can also create conflicts. Treat specifications as evidence to reconcile, not numbers to copy without context.

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Identify what was measured

For every important value, ask which physical configuration it describes. A body weight may exclude the head. A package weight may include accessories and protective materials. Height may be measured with or without the head, feet, or standing hardware. Bust or chest measurements can vary with soft construction and measuring tension.

The best listing makes the measurement basis clear. When it does not, ask support before using the value to set a handling limit or compare shipping.

Preserve the source value

If a manufacturer supplies **165 cm**, DollWow can display approximately **5 ft 5 in / 165 cm**. The conversion helps a US reader, but **5 ft 5 in** should not replace the original value in the product record. Likewise, a source weight of **35 kg** converts to approximately **77.2 lb / 35 kg**; rounding it to **77 lb** is appropriate for display, while the original remains the reference.

Useful conversion constants are:

- **1 in = 2.54 cm**
- **1 ft = 12 in**
- **1 kg = 2.20462 lb**
- **1 lb = 0.453592 kg**
- Celsius from Fahrenheit: **$(F - 32) \times 5/9$**
- Fahrenheit from Celsius: **$(C \times 9/5) + 32$**

Conversions should be consistent across the guide and storefront. They should not add false precision. If the source says approximately **80 lb**, publishing **36.2874 kg** suggests accuracy that does not exist. Use approximately **80 lb / 36 kg**.

Height and body scale

Height is most useful for visual scale and space planning. It is not a complete proxy for clothing size, weight, or ease of handling. Review shoulder, torso, hip, and limb measurements whenever those factors affect the decision.

For a seated or torso product, total height may describe a different orientation than a standing full body. Check product diagrams and do not compare the number as though both products use the same reference points.

Weight and shipping weight

Product weight helps plan lifting and storage. Shipping weight helps plan delivery and can include the carton, foam, accessories, head, and other components. Both matter, but for different stages.

If only shipping weight is available, do not publish it as body weight. If only body weight is available, do not assume the packaged carton is equally manageable. Request the missing value when it controls the purchase.

Circumference measurements

Bust or chest, waist, and hip values can help with clothing and body comparison. Check whether bust refers to the fullest point and whether underbust is listed separately. Softness and gel filling can affect how a garment fits even when the circumference appears correct.

Use flexible measuring tape without compressing the surface. Garment sizing varies by brand, so match actual garment measurements and stretch rather than relying only on labels such as small or medium.

Fixed and removable components

Specifications should identify removable inserts, heads, wigs, eyes, and electronic modules where relevant. "Removable" can describe a component intended for routine removal or one intended only for service. Confirm the expected frequency and connection method.

Material labels

Check material separately for the body, head, insert, and soft or gel-filled regions. A listing titled "silicone doll" may refer to a full silicone build, a silicone head with a TPE body, or a selectable material. The configured product determines the claim.

Named materials such as platinum silicone, ultra-soft formulations, or proprietary blends need manufacturer definitions. Do not translate a branded material name into a universal performance promise.

Option and inclusion tables

Some product tables combine standard features, selectable options, paid upgrades, and accessories. Separate them into four questions:

1. What is always included in the starting configuration? 2. What can be selected at no added cost? 3. What adds cost or production time? 4. What appears in photos but is not included?

The final order summary should answer all four. A product card cannot carry the complete option system, so use it to enter the product page rather than as the final purchasing record.

Resolving conflicting values

When the same page shows two heights or weights, do not silently choose one. Record the conflict, identify whether different materials or versions are involved, and request confirmation. Update the catalog only when the corrected value can be tied to the exact product.

Conflicts are especially important when they affect safe handling, shipping, compatibility, or a paid option. A small difference in a decorative measurement may be less consequential, but it should still be corrected when reliable evidence is available.

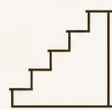
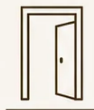
Size and Weight Matter More Than Buyers Expect

Height changes visual scale. Weight changes the entire ownership routine. A doll that weighs `79 lb / 36 kg` may be manageable for one buyer and impractical for another. The question is not whether the number sounds reasonable. The question is whether the buyer can lift, turn, clean, dress, and store that weight safely in the available space.

Plan the lift, doorway and storage route.

Height alone does not predict handling weight. Recheck current product measurements before ordering.

Size and Weight Matter More Than Buyers Expect

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Before checkout	What to measure or test
Carrying route	Doorways, stairs, corners, elevators, and distance from delivery point
Cleaning area	Tub or shower dimensions, lifting position, drainage, and drying space
Storage area	Length, width, ventilation, privacy, and pressure-free support
Buyer handling	Ability to lift a similar dead weight without unstable twisting
Clothing	Body measurements rather than height alone

Height should always appear in **ft/in + cm**, and weight in **lb + kg**. Body measurements should show **in + cm** where available. Conversions help comparison, but they do not improve an inaccurate source value. If a supplier measurement looks inconsistent, ask for confirmation before publishing or ordering.

Compact models can reduce storage demand, but height does not guarantee low weight. Material, internal foam, skeleton, head construction, and manufacturer weight-reduction methods all matter. Use [mini sex dolls](#) for smaller builds and compare each listed weight separately.

Build a handling plan before choosing a height

Start with the most difficult movement in the ownership routine. For one buyer that may be carrying the package upstairs. For another it may be turning the doll during cleaning or transferring it from storage to a bed. That movement should set the practical weight ceiling.

A useful home test is to handle a safely packed object with a similar weight. Keep the load close to the body, avoid twisting, and do not attempt the test alone if there is any doubt. A rigid gym weight is easier to grip than a soft articulated body, so passing the test does not mean a doll of the same weight will feel equally manageable.

Consider these details together:

- **Lift frequency:** occasional positioning is different from moving the doll several times per week.
- **Grip points:** hands, feet, fingers, wrists, ankles, and the neck are not carrying handles.
- **Transfer height:** lifting from a low case or floor position is harder than moving between surfaces at similar heights.

- **Stairs and corners:** the package may be longer and wider than expected even when its listed weight seems manageable.
- **Cleaning method:** a removable insert can reduce how often the complete body needs to be moved.
- **Mobility aids:** a stable cart, lift, storage case, or second adult may make a heavier model practical.

Read dimensions as a set

Height is the easiest number to market and often the least useful number by itself. Compare shoulder width, bust or chest, waist, hips, limb length, foot size, and package dimensions. Two dolls at **5 ft 3 in / 160 cm** can have very different visual scale, clothing fit, storage needs, and weight.

Body measurements also help prevent misleading labels. Words such as petite, curvy, athletic, or plus-size are descriptive categories, not standardized dimensions. The measurements are the evidence.

Plan clothing from measurements

Do not buy a wardrobe from the doll height alone. Match clothing to bust or chest, waist, hip, inseam, and foot measurements where those details are available. Stretch fabrics can tolerate some variation, while fitted garments may need tailoring. Remove dark or strongly dyed clothing after a short test period and check for transfer.

When a listed weight is missing

Do not estimate weight from a similar body or from a competitor listing. Ask DollWow to confirm the current manufacturer value for the exact body, head, material, and selected upgrades. A silicone head, gel-filled areas, electronic head, or skeleton option can change the final weight.

CHAPTER 08

Skeletons, Joints, Standing Feet, and Positioning

The skeleton determines movement and support inside the body. Marketing may describe an "EVO," "upgraded," "shrugging," or "flexible" skeleton, but the exact joint set varies by manufacturer and body.

Skeletons, Joints, Standing Feet, and Positioning

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Important questions include:

- Can the shoulders shrug or rotate beyond a standard joint?
- Are fingers articulated, wired, or fixed?
- Can the doll stand, and does standing require bolts or a support?
- Which positions are supported without forcing a joint?
- Does an upgrade add weight or change the body feel?
- Are any poses intended only for assisted photography?

Standing feet do not make a doll independently stable in every situation. Use support, avoid falls, and follow the exact supplier guidance. Do not leave a doll standing for long periods unless the manufacturer explicitly supports that storage method.

Read the detailed [sex doll skeleton guide](#) and [standing feet guide](#) before adding an upgrade.

What a skeleton can and cannot tell you

A skeleton diagram shows the internal joint layout, but it does not fully describe movement resistance, range, or long-term behavior. Joint tension varies by body and may change with use. Soft material can also limit a position before the metal joint reaches its theoretical range.

Useful manufacturer evidence includes a movement chart, official demonstration, body-specific option list, and care instructions. A generic pose photo is weaker evidence because the body may be supported outside the frame or prepared for a short photo session.

Joint questions worth asking

Ask about the exact model rather than whether the brand offers a feature somewhere in its range:

1. Does the neck move independently, and is the head removable? 2. Do the shoulders shrug, rotate, or support a raised-arm position? 3. What movement is available at the spine or waist? 4. Are hips designed for a wide range, and are there stated limits? 5. Are the fingers wired, articulated, or sculpted in place? 6. Do the ankles move, and how does that interact with standing feet? 7. Does the manufacturer recommend periodic joint adjustment or support?

Never force a joint through strong resistance. Support the limb near the joint and move it slowly. If a joint produces an unusual sound, becomes unexpectedly loose, or changes the surface shape sharply, stop and ask for product-specific guidance.

Standing systems and floor protection

Standing bolts or reinforced feet concentrate weight into a small area. Check whether hardware is exposed, concealed, or optional. Use a clean, stable, level surface and protect delicate flooring when appropriate. Standing should be supervised, with the body supported against a stable surface if the manufacturer recommends it.

Some feet prioritize appearance and others prioritize supported standing. Confirm which construction is shown in the selected product photos. Shoes may hide hardware, but they should fit without compressing toes or transferring dye.

Posing for storage is different from posing for a photo

A pose that is acceptable for a few minutes may place pressure on soft areas when held for days. Long-term storage should distribute weight, keep joints in a neutral position, avoid sharp bends, and prevent contact that creates dents or creases. Follow the body-specific storage instructions over a general posing tutorial.

CHAPTER 09

What Creates a Realistic Appearance

Realism is a combination of proportion, sculpt, finish, styling, and presentation. A higher price does not automatically produce the look a specific buyer prefers.

Realism is a combination of proportion, sculpt, finish, styling, and presentation. A higher price does not automatically produce the look a specific buyer prefers.

Detail	What to compare
Head sculpt	Face shape, expression, eye placement, mouth construction, and neck transition
Surface finish	Skin texture, seams, body painting, veins, freckles, and makeup durability
Eyes	Fixed or movable construction, color options, alignment, and replacement path
Hair	Wig quality, implanted hair availability, maintenance, and compatibility with electronics
Hands and feet	Sculpt detail, nail finish, finger construction, and standing hardware
Body proportion	Shoulder, bust or chest, waist, hip, leg, and head-to-body scale

Product photography can show the potential presentation, but it may include styling, lighting, wigs, clothing, or options that are not included. Confirm which head, body, skin tone, makeup, eyes, and hair are part of the selected configuration. Factory photos, when offered for a custom build, provide a useful checkpoint before shipment.

Separate the sculpt from the styling

When comparing photos, first evaluate features that belong to the product: face geometry, body proportions, hand and foot sculpting, surface texture, and transitions between parts. Then identify styling that may change: wig, clothing, makeup option, eye color, lighting, camera angle, and retouching.

This separation prevents a common disappointment. A compelling campaign image may show a premium wig, custom makeup, particular skin tone, and carefully fitted clothing. The standard product may still be excellent, but it will not necessarily arrive styled like the photograph.

Examine close-ups, not only hero images

A useful product gallery should let the buyer inspect:

- Front, side, and three-quarter views of the head.
- Neck connection and head-to-body proportion.
- Hands, fingers, nails, feet, and standing hardware.
- Surface texture and painted details in neutral light.
- Seams or mold lines where the manufacturer shows them.

- The exact body shape without clothing obscuring key proportions.

If the gallery combines several heads or bodies, identify which images correspond to the selectable configuration. Ask support when that mapping is unclear.

Realism in person includes touch and movement

Visual realism is only one dimension. Surface softness, weight distribution, joint movement, hair, and the way a body holds a pose all affect the experience. These qualities are difficult to prove from still photography. Prefer body-specific demonstrations and documented construction over broad claims such as "most realistic."

Look for consistency across evidence

The title, specifications, option selector, images, and manufacturer documentation should describe the same body. A mismatch does not always indicate deception; catalogs are complex and suppliers update products. It does mean the seller should verify the selected configuration before checkout.

CHAPTER 10

Customization Starts With the Exact Product

Customization can include skin tone, eyes, wigs, implanted hair, makeup, head choice, body painting, breasts or chest construction, inserts, standing feet, skeleton upgrades, heating, sound, and electronic functions. Availability is product-specific.

Choose the core body and head first, then verify compatibility for styling, structural upgrades, and optional functions.

Customization Starts With the Exact Product

Customization can include skin tone, eyes, wigs, implanted hair, makeup, head choice, body painting, breasts or chest construction, inserts, standing feet, skeleton upgrades, heating, sound, and electronic functions. Availability is product-specific.

Brand defaults are useful starting points, but they do not prove that every option is compatible with every SKU. A head function may conflict with implanted hair. A skeleton upgrade may be unavailable on a particular body. A custom tone may change production time. An electronic option may add weight.

Before paying for a custom build:

- Confirm every paid selection in writing.
- Check option compatibility against the exact head and body.
- Confirm the final option price and currency.
- Ask whether the option changes production time or shipping weight.
- Understand the factory-photo and approval process.
- Save the final configuration summary.

Use the live [custom doll collection](#), the [customization guide](#), and the DollWow [customization workflow](#) together.

Start with the body and head, then add options

Choose the body around handling, proportions, material, and intended use. Choose the head around sculpt, compatibility, and maintenance. Only then evaluate cosmetic, structural, and electronic upgrades. This order keeps optional features from distracting from the two components that define most of the finished product.

Build the configuration in four passes:

1. **Core build:** body, head, body material, head material, and skin tone. 2. **Appearance:** eyes, wig or implanted hair, makeup, nails, body painting, and other finish details. 3. **Construction:** skeleton, standing feet, softness, breasts or chest, inserts, and weight-reduction options. 4. **Functions and accessories:** heating, electronic features, sound, care items, storage, and clothing.

Review the complete configuration after each pass. If changing an early choice removes or changes a later option, ask for a revised written summary.

Treat option images as references

An eye-color swatch or skin-tone photograph can vary with lighting, camera settings, display calibration, and production batch. It is useful for comparison but not a promise of an exact screen color. Ask whether the reference is specific to the selected material because the same named tone may appear different on TPE and silicone.

Wig images show style and color, but wigs are removable styling items. Implanted hair is part of the head and requires a different maintenance decision. Confirm density, hairline, material, and whether the selected head supports implantation.

Understand compatibility before paying

Compatibility rules may involve more than two visible options. For example, a powered head could affect implanted hair, eye movement, oral construction, neck connection, or body compatibility. A lightweight body option could change gel-filled areas or structural choices. A standing-foot upgrade may depend on skeleton type.

The safest record is a product-specific configuration approved by the seller or manufacturer. A brand-wide menu is not proof that every combination can be built.

Factory photos and approval

When factory photos are available, ask what they will show and when approval is requested. Check the head, body, skin tone, makeup, eyes, hair choice, and visible options against the saved order. Factory photos are a quality checkpoint, not a substitute for written specifications or final inspection after delivery.

If something appears wrong, describe the mismatch precisely and refer to the saved configuration. Do not approve because production feels urgent. At the same time, recognize that lighting and phone cameras can alter color, so ask for clarification or another view when color is the only concern.

CHAPTER 11

Heating, Electronic, AI, and Robotic Features

Advanced features deserve more scrutiny than a visual option because they affect power, weight, compatibility, care, and after-sale support. A feature name alone is not enough.

Heating, Electronic, AI, and Robotic Features

Advanced features deserve more scrutiny than a visual option because they affect power, weight, compatibility, care, and after-sale support. A feature name alone is not enough.

Confirm the supported function, power source, controls, operating limits, cleaning restrictions, warranty path, and added weight. Temperatures should be presented in both **F + C** when the manufacturer provides an operating range. Never infer a safe temperature or usage routine from another brand's product.

AI-related features may involve a separate head, wearable device, speaker, app, or cloud service. Ask what works without a subscription, what data leaves the device, whether the service is available in the buyer's country, and what happens if the software is discontinued.

Only feature electronic products that are live in the DollWow catalog and supported by verified brand documentation. Search volume for robotic products is meaningful, but demand does not justify publishing unverified capabilities.

Heating is not one universal feature

The word "heating" may describe an internal warming system, an external accessory, a heated insert, or a brand-specific module. Confirm which areas warm, how the system is powered, whether it is removable, the documented operating range, and whether it changes cleaning or storage.

Do not use a heating system while the product is wet or damaged. Do not improvise power supplies or exceed the documented temperature. If the manufacturer provides a limit, present it in both **F + C** and keep the original source value visible.

Electronic head functions

Electronic heads may offer combinations of sound, jaw movement, eye movement, app control, or other functions. The feature set can differ between head models from the same manufacturer. Check:

- Exact supported head and body connections.
- Included controller, cable, battery, or power supply.
- Charging time and stated operating duration.
- Water restrictions and cleaning method.
- App name, operating-system support, and regional availability.
- Replacement, repair, and warranty process.
- Added weight and any effect on neck support.

AI dolls and sex robots

Searches for AI dolls, sex robots, and robotic companions often combine several different products: a conventional doll with an electronic head, a conversational app, a separate robotic device, or a prototype shown in media. Buyers should not assume that every product using "AI" can move, see, converse privately, or operate without another device.

For a connected feature, ask where conversation data is processed, whether an account is required, how recordings are handled, and what remains functional offline. Software availability can change after purchase, so buy for the functions supported now rather than a promised future update.

Ready-to-Ship vs Custom Order

Verify what "in stock" means

An in-stock label should correspond to a specific physical configuration and warehouse. Ask whether the listed head, body, material, skin tone, and included items match the photographed unit. Adding a major customization may convert an in-stock purchase into a factory order.

Warehouse location matters because it can affect dispatch, carrier options, transit, and import handling. It does not guarantee a delivery date. Current stock can also change quickly, so confirmation should be close to checkout.

Decide which tradeoff matters most

Choose ready to ship when timing, a known configuration, and a simpler order are the priorities. Choose custom when a specific head-body combination or option is more important than speed. Neither route is automatically lower risk; each requires a different set of checks.

For a ready-to-ship unit, request confirmation of current condition and exact inclusions. For a custom order, focus on compatibility, production records, factory photos, and approval. In both cases, save the final order details.

CHAPTER 13

What a Sex Doll Really Costs

The base price is only one part of the decision. Compare the configured total and the ownership setup.

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Cost area	Possible components
Product	Base body, head, included wig, and standard configuration
Options	Material, skin tone, hair, skeleton, standing, heating, electronics, and accessories
Delivery	Shipping method, destination, warehouse, and applicable duties or taxes
Setup	Storage support, care products, clothing, and safe handling equipment

Exact prices should come from the live catalog and current configuration. Avoid creating universal price bands that become stale or imply the same inclusions across brands. Product examples in this guide should carry a visible snapshot date and link to the current page.

Compare configured totals, not discount percentages

A large discount is not meaningful without a verified reference configuration. One listing may include a silicone head, standing feet, upgraded skeleton, shipping, or accessories while another treats them as paid options. Normalize the offers before deciding which price is lower.

Use a simple comparison sheet with these rows:

- Exact manufacturer, head, and body.
- Head and body material.
- Skin tone and appearance options.
- Structural upgrades and standing construction.
- Heating or electronic features.
- Included accessories and care items.
- Product price after valid discounts.
- Shipping, taxes, duties, or destination charges.
- Damage protection, factory photos, and support terms.

Budget for handling and care

Ownership setup does not need to be elaborate, but it should be suitable for the selected product. A heavier body may need a more supportive storage or transfer solution. A removable insert may need separate drying tools. Implanted hair requires different care from a removable wig. Electronic features may require protected storage and manufacturer-approved charging equipment.

Avoid buying a generic care bundle before confirming material and construction. The wrong cleaner, powder, adhesive, or lubricant can create unnecessary risk.

When a lower price is genuinely useful

A lower-cost model can be a good first purchase when its weight, material, dimensions, and support path fit the buyer. It is not necessary to buy every upgrade. A simpler configuration can reduce compatibility questions and make care easier.

The better value is the product that can be handled, maintained, and supported as intended. A low checkout price is poor value if the body cannot be moved safely or the configuration is unclear.

Brand names become useful after you know the material, weight, body type, and features you want. A manufacturer may be excellent at detailed silicone faces, broad TPE customization, compact torsos, fantasy bodies, or electronic features without being the best fit for every buyer.

Which Doll Brand Is Right for You?

Brand names become useful after you know the material, weight, body type, and features you want. A manufacturer may be excellent at detailed silicone faces, broad TPE customization, compact torsos, fantasy bodies, or electronic features without being the best fit for every buyer.

Use these profiles to decide which three or four brands deserve a closer look. Then compare exact bodies and heads. Product specifications and option compatibility always matter more than reputation alone.

WM Dolls: the established all-rounder

[WM Dolls](#) is one of the longest-established and most recognizable Chinese manufacturers in the category. Collectors know the brand for a very broad choice of TPE bodies, faces, proportions, and customization. Its newer ranges also include silicone and hybrid constructions, including silicone heads paired with softer bodies.

Best starting point for: a first-time buyer who wants many body and head choices inside a familiar manufacturer system, or an experienced buyer who already knows the exact proportions and options wanted.

What to check: WM has several material and skeleton generations, so do not assume an option seen on one model applies to another. Confirm the exact body, head connection, material, standing system, and selected upgrades. For a current example, compare [WM Nina 160cm D-Cup TPE](#), approximately **5 ft 3 in / 160 cm**.

Irontech Dolls: sculpting, variety, and newer material systems

[Irontech Dolls](#) entered the market around 2018 and developed a following for Western-inspired faces, curvier body sculpting, and detailed presentation. The manufacturer expanded from TPE into full silicone and now offers female and male bodies, specialty constructions, and advanced options on selected models.

Best starting point for: buyers prioritizing expressive face sculpts, curvy proportions, full silicone choices, or one manufacturer with both female and male ranges.

What to check: promotional styling can be elaborate, so identify the exact head, makeup, wig, and skin tone used in the image. New named features should be verified on the selected body rather than assumed across the range. Compare the TPE [Irontech Len Stilwell 158cm](#) with the silicone [Irontech Evie 161cm](#).

SE Doll: broad choice with strong makeup and fantasy styling

[SE Doll](#) was established in 2016 with production in Shenzhen, China. The brand became known for a wide selection of TPE and silicone dolls, detailed makeup, fantasy and elf-inspired heads, and continued experimentation with electronic and robotic features.

Best starting point for: buyers who want to compare realistic and fantasy styling within the same brand, or who value detailed makeup and a broad body range.

What to check: painted detail needs gentler care, especially on TPE. Confirm whether a pictured finish is standard or an upgraded makeup option. Electronic features are product-specific. Start with [SE Doll Josie 148cm D-Cup TPE](#), approximately **4 ft 10 in / 148 cm**, or browse the silicone choices in the brand hub.

SY Dolls: bold proportions and accessible variety

[SY Dolls](#) is a Chinese manufacturer known for curvy, fashion-forward bodies, vivid makeup, and a large choice of TPE models. The current range also includes silicone and silicone-head constructions, compact products, and full-size bodies.

Best starting point for: buyers drawn to pronounced hourglass proportions, high-impact styling, and a choice between more accessible TPE and selected silicone builds.

What to check: body shape can be intentionally stylized, so compare measurements and neutral full-body views rather than relying on height. Confirm whether body painting, head material, and makeup shown are included. Best starting point for: buyers prioritizing facial realism, detailed surface finish, full silicone construction, and collectible presentation.

What to check: softer silicone and weight-reduction options can change care, compression resistance, weight, and production time. Confirm which version is selected. See [Starpery Yuan 154cm E-Cup Silicone](#), approximately **5 ft 1 in / 154 cm**.

YL Dolls: established TPE with fantasy influence

[YL Dolls](#) has produced life-size dolls in China since around 2013. The brand is closely associated with the wider manufacturing ecosystem familiar to WM buyers, but it has its own faces and body designs, including fantasy-influenced looks and dramatic proportions.

Best starting point for: buyers who like the customization depth of established TPE manufacturers but want distinct faces, cosplay potential, or less conventional body shapes.

What to check: never assume cross-brand head compatibility from visual similarity alone. Confirm neck connection, skin tone, and head-body pairing in writing. A current starting point is [YL Vevina 151cm E-Cup TPE](#), approximately **4 ft 11 in / 151 cm**.

Dolls Castle: realistic and fantasy bodies in one range

[Dolls Castle](#) dates to around 2016 and offers TPE and silicone dolls across realistic, curvy, and fantasy-led designs. Buyers may encounter conventional full-size models alongside more theatrical bodies with distinctive proportions or character styling.

How to Evaluate a Listing

A polished product page can still leave important questions unanswered. Review the facts in this order:

Treat missing facts as
questions, not assumptions.



A useful listing audit separates verified product facts from styling, optional upgrades, and details that still need confirmation.

How to Evaluate a Listing

A polished product page can still leave important questions unanswered. Review the facts in this order:

1. Exact brand, head, body, and model name. 2. Body and head material. 3. Height, weight, and body measurements. 4. Included items versus optional styling. 5. Live availability or production status. 6. Option compatibility and added cost. 7. Shipping origin and timing language. 8. Factory-photo, return, damage, and support process.

Save the configuration or quote before payment. If the product title, description, option selector, and supplier notes disagree, pause and request written clarification.

A three-pass listing audit

Pass one: identity. Confirm manufacturer, model, body, head, material, and height. Product names can be rewritten by retailers, so use specifications and manufacturer references to establish whether two offers describe the same item.

Pass two: configuration. Separate standard inclusions from photographed styling and paid options. Build the intended configuration and note every price change. Check that the selected head and body support each option.

Pass three: fulfillment. Confirm whether the exact configuration is in a warehouse or must be produced, where it ships from, what checkpoints are offered, and how damage or mismatch is reported.

Specification conflicts

Catalog errors can occur when a manufacturer revises a body, a retailer combines several options, or older copy remains attached to a current listing. Weight and measurements deserve special attention. If two parts of a page disagree, do not choose the more favorable value. Ask which specification applies to the exact selected build.

Keep a screenshot or exported configuration that shows the date, product URL, selected options, and final price. This creates a shared reference if the storefront changes later.

Product photography checks

Look for repeated images across listings, mismatched head and body combinations, inconsistent skin tone, and photos that show accessories not named in the inclusions. Supplier campaign photography is legitimate, but the page should make clear which components are standard, optional, or styling only.

An image watermark from the actual manufacturer can help establish provenance, but a watermark alone does not prove that a retailer is authorized or that the photographed configuration is available. Verify the seller and the product separately.

CHAPTER 17

Scam and Buyer-Protection Checks

Common warning signs include copied images paired with implausible specifications, dramatic discounts without a comparable configuration, missing business contact details, unclear payment protection, vague shipping promises, and reviews that cannot be tied to a real purchase system.

Check whether the seller can explain the exact product, options, final price, delivery path, and support process. Authorization documents are useful when available, but they should identify the actual brand and seller. A logo displayed on a site is not authorization by itself.

Do not send payment because a countdown timer or low-stock message creates pressure. Compare the complete offer, save the listing, and use [DollWow's scam guide](#), [buyer protection information](#), and [price-match review](#).

Check the business, not just the homepage

Review contact details, policy pages, payment methods, and the consistency of the business name across checkout and support. Search the domain and business name independently. A recently created site is not automatically fraudulent, and an old domain is not automatically trustworthy, but unexplained inconsistencies increase risk.

Confirm that support can answer a model-specific question. A useful answer should identify the relevant body, material, option, or manufacturer process. Generic reassurance does not resolve a specification concern.

Treat reviews as supporting evidence

Reviews can reveal recurring service patterns, but they are not a substitute for product facts. Look for a range of dates, details, and outcomes. Be cautious when every review uses similar language, only discusses shipping speed, or makes claims that cannot be tied to the reviewed configuration.

Treat reviews as one source of context, not proof that the same product will fit your needs. Product examples in this guide are comparison starting points, not customer endorsements or claims that an item is universally popular.

Payment and pressure signals

Use payment methods with appropriate buyer protection and confirm the merchant shown at checkout. Be cautious when a seller pushes an unusual payment route, asks to move the transaction away from its documented checkout, or changes the final terms through private messages.

Countdowns, dramatic stock alerts, and oversized discount percentages should not replace verification. A genuine sale can still be evaluated calmly by comparing the complete configuration and written terms.

Counterfeit and lookalike listings

Copied manufacturer photos may be paired with a different product, material, or scale. Compare the head sculpt, body measurements, official model name, and brand documentation. A price far below comparable configured offers needs an explanation, not an assumption that the same product is being sold more efficiently.

When authorization matters, ask for current evidence and verify it with the manufacturer when possible. Do not rely on a logo collage or an unsupported "official" label.

Before ordering, confirm the packaging description, shipping origin, carrier process, destination access, and the contact information used for delivery. A full-size package can be large and heavy, so plan how it moves from the delivery point to the inspection area.

Custom production, warehouse dispatch, transit, customs, and final delivery are separate stages. Avoid treating one estimated number as a guaranteed arrival date. Read [DollWow shipping information](#), [shipping protection](#), and the [discreet shipping guide](#).

Map the complete delivery route

Measure from the place where the carrier will stop to the place where the carton will be opened. Include gates, lifts, stair turns, narrow doors, shared corridors, and any location where the package might need to stand temporarily. A domestic warehouse can simplify transit for an existing unit, but confirm that the exact selected configuration is physically there. A brand offered by a domestic warehouse may still require factory production for custom options.

For cross-border orders, ask who handles duties, taxes, customs documents, and brokerage charges. Rules depend on destination and can change, so confirm the current order path for your address.

Delivery-day checklist

- Keep the tracking number and support contact available.
- Clear the route and inspection area.
- Arrange an adult helper or equipment when required by the package weight.
- Have a phone ready to photograph the carton before opening.

Prepare the inspection area

Use a clean, dry surface with enough room for the full body and packaging. Remove jewelry, sharp objects, rough fasteners, and anything that could transfer dye. Good neutral lighting makes it easier to compare skin tone, seams, painted details, and possible transit marks.

The body may be secured with foam, fabric, straps, or protective wrapping. Remove each layer slowly. Do not use a long blade near the product and do not pull the body by a single limb to free it from the carton.

Create an arrival record

Photograph the shipping label, all sides of the carton, internal packing, and the product as first revealed. This creates a dated record if there is transit damage, a missing component, or a configuration mismatch.

Control the environment

Store in a dry, moderate environment away from direct sunlight, open flames, radiators, and extreme temperatures. If the product has electronics or batteries, follow separate charging and long-term storage instructions. Do not seal a body in storage while moisture remains.

Clothing routine

Wash new clothing separately before use when appropriate, then test for dye transfer. Remove metal pieces or rough fasteners that press into the skin. Choose sizes from actual body measurements and avoid tight elastic that creates prolonged compression.

- Is this exact configuration physically in stock or made after ordering?
- Where will it ship from?
- Which stages are included in the current time estimate?
- Are factory photos offered, and what can be corrected before approval?
- What package dimensions and shipping weight should I plan for?
- Which shipping, tax, duty, or brokerage charges are included?

Support and care

- Which care products and storage method does the manufacturer approve?
- How should arrival damage or a configuration mismatch be documented?
- Which warranty terms apply to this exact product and options?
- Who handles a manufacturer-specific repair or electronic fault?

Written answers should be attached to the final configuration record. If a decision-critical question remains unresolved, delay checkout rather than filling the gap with an assumption.

Discarding packaging immediately

Inspect areas that experienced pressure during shipping or storage. Check clothing contact points, hairline, makeup, fingers, toes, and standing hardware. Confirm that the chosen storage position distributes weight and is easy to access without pulling a limb.

Create a private care record containing:

- Product, body, head, and materials.
- Approved cleaner, powder, lubricant, and repair references.
- Cleaning and drying notes.

- Storage method and barrier materials.
- Electronic model, app, charger, and account details where relevant.
- Support contact and order number.

Weeks two through four

Refine the routine around real use. Note whether the storage space ventilates, whether the body is practical to transfer, and whether clothing or wigs show signs of transfer. Inspect joints and surfaces without forcing movement.

Avoid introducing several new care products at once. When a change causes a problem, a simple routine makes the cause easier to identify.

End-of-month review

Ask five questions:

1. Can the doll be moved and positioned safely with the current setup?
2. Is cleaning followed by complete drying every time?
3. Does storage avoid pressure, dye, moisture, and environmental extremes?
4. Are electronic and hair components being handled according to their separate instructions?
5. Are any surface, joint, or configuration concerns worth documenting for support?

Update the care record and keep product-specific guidance accessible. A stable routine should become easier, not more complicated, after the first month.

CHAPTER 26

How to Resolve Confusing or Conflicting Product Claims

New buyers often find two different weights, option names that sound similar, or a product photo that does not match the written description. That does not always mean the seller is dishonest. Manufacturers revise bodies, retailers combine data feeds, and older photography can remain in circulation. It does mean the conflict should be resolved before payment.

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Start with the exact configuration

Write down the body, head, material, skin tone, skeleton, standing system, and every paid option. A general brand page cannot confirm a detail that changes by body or head.

Use the most specific source

Check information in this order:

1. Written details for the exact product and selected configuration. 2. Current manufacturer documentation for that body, head, material, or option. 3. Written confirmation from support that identifies the product. 4. General articles, videos, forum posts, and older reviews.

A forum post can reveal a useful question, but it should not overrule current instructions for a different formulation or body.

Ask for a direct answer

Quote both conflicting claims and ask which one applies. For example: "The specifications show **77 lb / 35 kg**, but the option description shows **88 lb / 40 kg**. Which weight applies with this head and lightweight body option?"

Specific questions are easier to verify than "Is this listing accurate?" Save the response with the final order.

Know which facts change most often

Price, stock, warehouse location, production time, app support, and available options can change quickly. Material, body mold, height, and basic construction are usually more stable but can still be revised. Check a current product page before ordering even when an older guide or video appears detailed.

Treat photography as evidence with limits

Product photos can establish sculpt, proportion, and potential finish. They may not establish the standard wig, clothing, makeup, eyes, skin tone, or included accessories. Ask which options created the pictured configuration.

Generated illustrations can explain lifting, measuring, cleaning, or storage, but they should not be used to judge what an actual doll looks like. Use real product images for that decision.

Leave unknown details unknown

If a decision-critical weight, material, option, or electronic function cannot be confirmed, remove the product from the shortlist or postpone the order. A plausible estimate is not useful when the purchase is expensive or difficult to return.

Pre-Purchase Checklist

- I confirmed the exact brand, head, body, and model.
- I checked material for both head and body.
- I checked height in **ft/in + cm** and weight in **lb + kg**.
- I measured the delivery route, cleaning area, and storage space.
- I can safely handle the listed weight or have planned assistance.
- I reviewed each option, added cost, conflict, and production effect.
- I know whether the item is ready to ship or made to order.
- I reviewed the complete delivered price.
- I understand the factory-photo or approval process, if offered.
- I reviewed privacy, shipping, damage, return, and support information.
- I saved the final configuration before payment.

FAQs

What should a first-time buyer prioritize?

Prioritize manageable weight, clear measurements, straightforward material care, storage space, a simple configuration, and responsive support. A visually impressive doll that is difficult to handle is rarely a good first purchase.

Is TPE or silicone better?

Neither is universally better. TPE is often softer and available at lower entry prices, while silicone is often chosen for fine surface detail and simpler surface cleaning. Manufacturer formulation, body construction, weight, care, and budget should decide the comparison.

How heavy is a full-size sex doll?

Weight varies widely by height, body shape, material, internal construction, and lightweight technology. Check the exact listing in both pounds and kilograms, then plan lifting, cleaning, stairs, and storage around that number.

Are mini dolls always lightweight?

No. Smaller height can reduce material volume, but construction and material still matter. Compare the listed weight of each mini or petite model rather than assuming it will be easy to lift.

What makes a sex doll look realistic?

Realism comes from proportion, head sculpt, eyes, surface texture, body painting, hair, hands, feet, styling, and the match between the selected head and body. Lighting and clothing can make catalog photos look different from the standard configuration.

Can every doll be customized?

No. Options vary by brand, body, head, material, and model. Product-specific option data should take priority over brand-wide defaults.

How long does a custom doll take?

Timing depends on the manufacturer, configuration, production queue, factory-photo process, destination, and shipping method. Request a current estimate before checkout and treat it as an estimate unless DollWow can operationally guarantee it.

What does discreet shipping mean?

It generally refers to plain or neutral outer packaging, but buyers should also ask about billing language, tracking, delivery communication, and package handling when those details matter.

How often should a sex doll be cleaned?

Clean according to use, material, construction, and manufacturer guidance. Internal areas should be cleaned when needed and dried completely before storage. Avoid universal schedules that ignore the exact product.

Can a doll remain standing for storage?

Only when the exact product and manufacturer support it, and usually with appropriate assistance or support. Standing feet do not guarantee independent stability or make prolonged standing suitable for every body.

Are factory photos important?

They can provide a useful checkpoint for custom orders by showing the completed configuration before shipment. Confirm what the approval process covers and what happens when a visible detail does not match the order.

How can I avoid a misleading listing?

Verify the brand, model, materials, measurements, included items, stock status, option costs, and support process. Save the final configuration and request written clarification when the page contains conflicting details.

Does a more expensive doll always last longer?

No. Price can reflect material, size, finish, brand, options, and production complexity. Longevity also depends on formulation, construction, handling, cleaning, storage, and repair support.

Can DollWow compare another seller's offer?

Yes. Submit the exact product and configured offer through the [price-match page](#). Comparable products need the same brand, model, options, shipping context, and included items.

What size sex doll is easiest to manage?

There is no universal easiest height. The most manageable product is one whose weight, width, grip, cleaning method, and storage path fit the buyer. Start with a personal weight ceiling, then compare compact and lightweight models using exact specifications.

How do I convert a doll's height from centimeters to feet and inches?

Use **1 in = 2.54 cm**, then divide total inches into feet and remaining inches. DollWow presents both systems where the source measurement is available. A converted number should not imply more precision than the manufacturer supplied.

Why can two dolls of the same height have different weights?

Body volume, material density, foam core, skeleton, head construction, breast or chest filling, and lightweight systems all affect weight. Compare the complete build rather than estimating from height.

Is a torso doll a good first purchase?

It can be when easier storage, lower overall scale, or a specific form is the priority. Some torsos are still dense and heavy, so check listed weight, dimensions, cleaning construction, and the area needed for storage. Browse [torso dolls](#) as a distinct category.

What is a hybrid sex doll?

Hybrid commonly describes a build using different materials for the head and body, such as a silicone head with a TPE body. The term can also be used differently by manufacturers. Confirm the material of each component and the care routine for both.

Is a silicone head compatible with every TPE body?

No. Neck connection, scale, skin tone, power connections, and manufacturer compatibility can differ. Use the option list for the exact body and ask for confirmation before combining parts.

Are standing feet necessary?

No. They are useful when supported standing is part of the intended routine, but they may introduce visible or concealed hardware and do not make every doll independently stable. Buyers planning flat or case storage may prioritize other features.

What is an upgraded or EVO skeleton?

It is manufacturer-specific language for revised joints or movement. The name does not define one standard feature set. Check the body-specific diagram or documentation for shoulder, spine, hip, finger, and other movement.

Can a sex doll sit in a chair for storage?

Only when the manufacturer supports the position and pressure is distributed appropriately. Long-term sitting can compress soft areas or stress joints. A pose that works for a photograph may not be suitable for storage.

Should I choose a fixed or removable insert?

A removable insert can simplify separate cleaning and drying for some buyers. Fixed construction may be preferred for other reasons but requires a reliable internal cleaning and drying plan. Confirm the exact product construction and replacement path.

Do sex dolls arrive assembled?

It varies. A body and head may be packed separately, and accessories or electronic components may require installation. Follow the exact unboxing and connection instructions rather than forcing a part that looks familiar.

What comes with a sex doll?

Included items vary by manufacturer and product. A wig, clothing, stand, care kit, insert, tools, storage item, or electronic accessory shown in photography may be optional. Use the written inclusion list and final configuration.

Can I use ordinary soap or household cleaner?

Do not assume it is compatible. Use products and conditions approved for the exact material and finish. Household solvents, abrasives, oils, dyes, and strong cleaners can damage surfaces or painted details.

Does TPE always need powder?

Care requirements vary by formulation and finish. Follow the current manufacturer guidance for the exact body. Do not apply a generic powder because another TPE brand recommends it.

How do I prevent clothing stains?

Wash and test clothing when appropriate, favor light and low-transfer fabrics, avoid prolonged tight contact, and inspect contact areas. A stain treatment must be approved for the exact material before use.

Can TPE and silicone dolls touch in storage?

Keep products and loose material parts separated unless compatibility is confirmed. Formulations can react or transfer oils and color. Use approved light-colored barriers and manufacturer storage guidance.

How should a doll with implanted hair be cleaned?

Protect the hairline, avoid pulling and unnecessary saturation, and follow the head-specific instructions. Implanted hair may also affect compatibility with electronic head features. A removable wig usually has a separate care routine.

Are sex doll apps private?

Privacy depends on the specific app, device, account, and service. Review what data is collected, where processing occurs, which permissions are requested, whether recordings are stored, and what works offline. Do not infer privacy from the product category.

Is an AI sex doll the same as a sex robot?

Not necessarily. An AI doll may combine a conventional body with conversational software or an electronic head. A sex robot may imply physical movement, but the term is used loosely. Compare documented functions rather than labels.

Does heating warm the whole doll?

Not always. Systems may warm selected internal or external areas, use a separate accessory, or depend on a specific body. Confirm coverage, power, limits, and cleaning restrictions for the exact option.

What should I inspect in factory photos?

Check the selected head and body, skin tone, makeup, eyes, hair, standing construction, and visible options against the saved order. Ask for clarification when lighting affects color. Factory photos do not replace checking written specifications.

What should I do if the delivered skin tone looks different?

Photograph it in neutral lighting and compare it with the order and factory photos. Screen color, camera processing, lighting, material, and production variation can affect appearance. Contact support before using an unapproved surface treatment.

Can a small tear be repaired at home?

Some minor damage can be repaired with manufacturer-approved materials and instructions, but the correct method depends on formulation and location. Document the issue and ask support before applying adhesive, heat, or solvent.

How should I compare prices between stores?

Match the exact brand, model, head, body, material, options, inclusions, shipping origin, and delivered charges. Starting prices and discount percentages are not comparable when the configurations differ.

Are ready-to-ship dolls used or returned products?

Ready to ship describes availability, not condition. Ask whether the exact unit is new, which configuration it has, where it is stored, and what inspection applies. Do not infer condition from the stock label alone.

Can I customize an in-stock doll?

Only within what is available for that physical unit. Changing the head, wig, eyes, or removable accessories may be possible, while changing body material, skeleton, or molded construction generally requires a different unit or factory order. Confirm before checkout.

How often should I review care instructions?

Review them when the product arrives, before using a new care product, after adding an electronic or replacement component, and whenever the manufacturer updates documentation. Keep the exact model and material in a private care record.

What records should I keep after purchase?

Keep the order summary, selected options, product screenshots, support confirmations, factory photos, shipping record, arrival photos, and manufacturer care instructions. These records help with future maintenance and support.

Why does this guide not cover every doll brand?

The detailed profiles focus on brands whose current products you can inspect and compare through DollWow. Other manufacturers exist, but naming a brand without current products, specifications, and a support path would not help you complete a purchase.

How current are the products in this guide?

Product cards use current catalog information when the page loads. Price, availability, and specifications can still change, so open the product page and confirm the final configuration before purchase.
